



**Vaccination**

- All campers, volunteers and staff are not required but are strongly encouraged to receive a COVID-19 vaccination (and those eligible, the booster(s) and be fully vaccinated at least two weeks before arriving at the camp session.

**Before Coming To Camp**

- We ask that all campers, volunteers, and staff arrive at camp in a healthy state. In the days prior to attending your event, be mindful of how you’re feeling. If you are experiencing any [COVID-19 related symptoms](#), please see a healthcare professional to ensure you’re healthy to attend camp.
- All campers, volunteers, and staff will be administered a health screening before each event. This brief health screening will consist of a series of questions and temperature check taken by the camp nurse or health officer upon arrival at camp.

**Face Coverings**

- Based on the county levels the week prior to the camp event in which a camper, staff, or volunteer resides, and following the [CDC’s COVID-19 Community Level map](#), use of face coverings are outlined below:

Green (Low) and Yellow (Medium) Counties	Red (High) Counties
Masks may be worn by any camper, staff, or volunteer but will not be required.	Proof of negative COVID-19 test administered prior to camp is required upon check-in * <b>OR</b> The individual will be required to wear a mask while indoors.

- If it is determined you reside in a high transmission county the week prior to your camp event, a representative of SUSCRM will contact you with detailed instructions of how to prepare for your week of camp.
- \* Due to the possibility of having to administer a COVID test prior to attending camp, we strongly recommend that households have testing kits in stock and accessible. Order your FREE at home COVID-19 tests here: [covid.gov/tests](https://www.covid.gov/tests).

**Programming and General Health Safety Practices**

- Emphasis will be placed on maximizing outdoor space for all programming including activities, worship, and meals.
- When campers are present in cabins or other indoor spaces, windows will be open and fans turned on as available to promote airflow and ventilation.
- Handwashing and hand sanitizing opportunities will be provided before and after meals, activities, and interactions.

### **COVID-19 Cancellation Policy**

- If prior to camp a camper is unable to attend their week of camp due to exposure to COVID-19 or being actively positive with COVID-19, a full refund will be issued or registration fees can be transferred to a later week of camp.
